- 4. Read some of all of the verses (found on your message outline) in support of God being revealed in the Scripture as Triune, Sovereign and Redemptive.
 - In your opinion, which of these categories (Triune, Sovereign, Redemptive) is typically the most helpful or comforting in your daily life? Why do you say this?
- 5. If a friend were to ask you, "What is the difference between the God you believe in, and any other God out there?" how might you respond?
