Introduction:

"Covenant" = An agreement or arrangement between God and people Old Covenant lasted from Moses to Jesus' Death – conditional, law-based New Covenant was inaugurated at Jesus's Death – unconditional, grace-based

What Does It Mean to be Part of This New Covenant Community?

The Church = EKKLESIA (called out community)

Ref. Ezekiel 36:25 – I will cleanse you from all your impurities...

The starting place for the New Covenant is God's total forgiveness of us

Understanding Total Forgiveness

Ref. 1 John 1:9
The false-beliefs of the Gnostics:
1. Jesus was not really
2. Sin does not really
Gnostic Dualism: They claimed that matter is and spirit is
1 John 1:1-4 confronts the first false-belief, that Jesus wasn't human

1 John 1:5-9 confronts the second false-belief, that sin doesn't exist

1 John 2:1-2 transitions to the true believers in the church...

Atoning Sacrifice = "Propitiation" (Full satisfaction of God's anger against sin)

Conclusion: How does a forgiven person live? As a forgiving person...in gratefulness and godliness.

Some Additional New Covenant Promises on Forgiveness...

Jesus' death put the New Covenant into effect (Heb. 9:16, 22)
The New Covenant makes us holy (Heb. 10:8-10)
Jesus' sacrifice cleansed us once, not repeatedly (Heb.10:1-3;1Peter 3:18)
Jesus took away all our sins at once (Heb. 9:26-28, 10:4-5; 1 John 3:5)
Jesus has already forgiven all our sin (Heb. 10:17-18; Col. 2:13-14; Eph. 4:32)
