Hell is described using vivid imagery in various passages of the Bible (i.e weeping and gnashing of teeth in Matt. 13, darkness in Matt. 25:30, flames in Luke 16:24, a place that will be cast into the Lake of Fire in Revelation 20, etc.). How would you answer the sincere question of a friend who asks, "How could a loving God send anybody to a place like Hell?" Discuss...
- 4. Our Heavenly existence will include a brand new body to go along with everything else restored to an Eden-like state of perfection. What are the questions you ponder when you reflect on what Heaven will be like for those who turn to Christ as Savior from sin? Discuss...

Promptings:

- 5. Do you sense a degree of personal urgency when sharing the reality of Heaven and Hell with people? Why or why not?
- 6. Think of one person you love who does not, to your knowledge, have a genuine relationship with Christ. Will you set a reminder in your phone to pray for that person by name every day in the week ahead, and ask God for an opportunity to share God's message of salvation with them?
