## **Ponderings:**

2. In the "Great Commission," Jesus tells us to "go and make disciples." What many do not realize is that the word "go" is a participle, not a command. The command is to make disciples. More literally, the verse should say, "as you are going, make disciples."

In other words, "as you are going...to the grocery store, the barber shop, the soccer game, the family gathering, etc...make discipples."

How does this understanding affect the way you might interpret and respond to Christ's directives in this passage? Discuss...

- 3. Valley has decided to partner with Compassion International for numerous reasons: integrity, longevity, effectiveness, Christ-centeredness, etc. What are your thoughts about this new partnership, and why is it so critical that we never lose sight of the "ends of the earth," even as we're simultaneously called to reach our "Jerusalem?" Discuss...
- 4. What are the most common ways we get distracted from consciously participating in the Great Commission? How can we purposefully correct this tendency to be distracted? Discuss...

# **Promptings:**

5. If we (believers) invested the same level of passion into the Great Commission that we often invest in politics, social issues, etc. how might the spiritual landscape of nations change?

While political and social change is not unimportant, are you willing to adjust your priorities to reflect God's priority of bringing the Gospel to all peoples of the world? Discuss what that might look like in practical terms...
